Location Update:

Occupy Tucson Has Moved: On Thursday night at approximately 11pm, the Tucson Police Department forced Occupy Tucson to vacate Armory Park. Occupy Tucson moved to Veinte de Agosto Park (also called Pancho Villa Park), which is the broad median strip on Broadway north of La Placita Village. The entrance to the park is on the crosswalk at Church Street. There was NO violence and there were no arrests; it was a peaceful response to a potential crisis. It took 2 hours to break down the entire camp, and Occupy Tucson left Armory Park spotless.
